“I didn’t really take it the way I should,” says Robbie. “I did well for a while — graduated from the program and got a nice job.” But after a year of sobriety, one pass by the beer cooler at the store flipped Robbie’s world upside down.

“Next thing you know, I’m losing my house. I’m drinking it up. And then I was living in a motel,” says Robbie. “I would pay my motel bill, then I would make sure I had enough money to get my beer, cigarettes, and some ramen.”

Robbie started bringing alcohol to work. He soon found himself jobless with one week left in his motel room and no way to hide the addiction that gripped him.

“All of a sudden, I cried out to God,” says Robbie. “Sometimes, there might be nothing else that’s going to get your attention than hitting rock bottom.”

But God works all things together for good, for

those who love him, who are called according to his purpose (Romans 8:28). Robbie called the Winston-Salem Rescue Mission once more, afraid and ashamed. But because you give, there was a place for Robbie to begin again.

NEW JOY, NEW PEACE

Today, Robbie has men in the program laughing “from breakfast to lights out.” He loves to bring joy to people’s faces, and for the first time in years, he feels confident in himself and confident in his future.

“I cannot count the times that I should’ve been dead or put in prison,” says Robbie. “It makes me feel like I have a purpose. God saved me for something.”

To you, Robbie gives his deepest gratitude. “We don’t need for anything inside this building,” he says. “This place is run by people who love God and want to help. People don’t have to do that. It’s unbelievable what they are willing to do.”

This holiday season, men who were once struggling in addiction will be celebrating Christmas — and a remarkable milestone! — with renewed hope.


